Fort Guijarros: Soldiers, Yankee Whalers, and Fisherfolk



Our newest exhibit, 'Fort Guijarros: Soldiers, Yankee Whalers, and Fisherfolk' is currently open at the San Diego Archaeological Center. The story of Ft. Guijarros, the Spanish colonial fort established in 1797 on Ballast Point, is told through material collected from archaeological excavations, military sources, and stories from the whaling industry. The exhibit has been the result of collaboration between the Center, the Navy, San Diego State University, and Fort Guijarros Museum Foundation.

The Fort Guijarros Collection, curated at the SDAC, was recovered from excavations led by local archaeologist Ron May and his team volunteers from 1981 to 1995. Today, the numerous reports, field notes, and photographs of the excavation are archived at the Fort Guijarros Museum Foundation at SDSU. Permission for obtaining records and photographs for the exhibit were granted by Ron, Jaime Lennox, SDSU, and the Ft. Guijarros Museum Foundation.

Other individuals and organizations responsible for making this exhibit a reality also deserve special recognition. Dr. Kevin Sheehan from The San Diego Maritime Museum was able to lend us several valuable pieces that are important for telling the story of American whalers at Ballast Point. Exhibit pieces were also acquired on loan from Tom Vilicich—San Pasqual Battlefield Volunteers Association and

from Center volunteers Pete Hoffman, Jim Bryant, and Andy Shulkosky. Photographs and artwork were acquired from Michael Nabholz and Pam Martin, Penelope Bledsoe from the Casa de España, Balboa Park and ICF International-San Diego.

We invite you to come and experience these stories and learn about events surrounding the forgotten past in this part of San Diego.

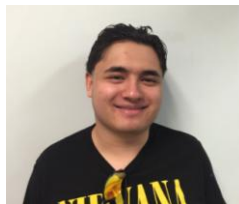
Welcome to Our New Fall Interns & Volunteers!

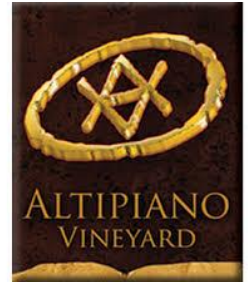

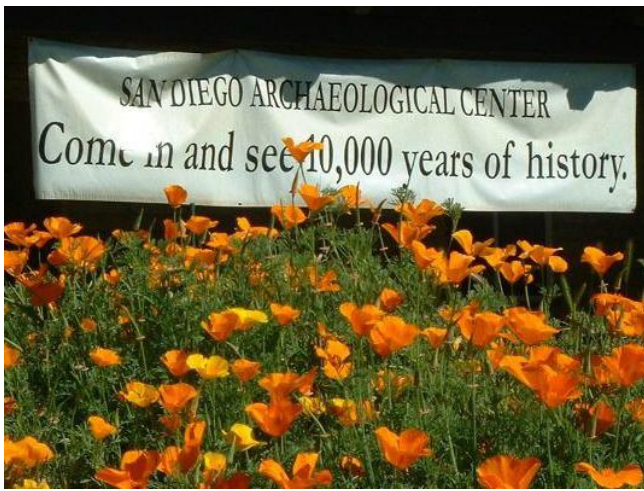
