What is Archaeology?

ARCHAEOLOGY is the study of people in the past through the objects that they made and left behind.

Sometimes archaeologists study animal remains, but only if they are related to human activity.

Many people confuse archaeology with paleontology.

PALEONTOLOGY is the study of the history of life on Earth as based on plant and animal fossils, including those of dinosaurs. Paleontologists do NOT study people.



Archaeologists don't dig dinosaurs!

Archaeologists love dinosaurs as much as you do, but we don't study them.


